What is a Family Council?

All Long-Term Care homes are required to encourage family and friends of Residents to participate in a Family Council. At Cassellholme, we also do it because we know you are affected by both the positive outcomes and the challenges that your loved ones experience.

We are an organized, self-led group, composed of family members and friends of the Residents – offering opportunities for families to share experiences, provide support to one another and discuss ways to enhance life at Cassellholme.

What's a meeting like?

We talk about a wide range of topics from admission procedures, communication about the plan of care, and humanizing discharge: to palliative care, hand hygiene and evacuation measures. As a member, you'll get up-to-date information from Cassellholme about both successes and issues faced in delivering compassionate care to Residents.

What's our purpose?

Cassellholme's Family Council is a group of volunteers who provide support, information, education and advocacy to Residents, friends and family members. We encourage and plan activities for Residents. We also foster partnerships with staff, Residents' Council, administrators and families. Meetings are held on the first Tuesday of every month, 2:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.
