Take the first steps!

1. Fill in a form cassellholme.ca/volunteer/ [printed copies are available at Cassellholme].
2. Email it to volunteer@cassellholme.ca or drop it off at Cassellholme.
3. We'll call you to schedule an interview. If it feels like a good fit for you, and for us, we'll contact your references.
4. Every volunteer over 18 needs to get a criminal reference check [CPIC] before they start volunteering – you'll be reimbursed for the cost.
5. The last step is to sign you up for a one-hour volunteer orientation.
