# Welcome (2:10 p.m.)

The Family Council held this in-person meeting in the Armstrong Room at Cassellholme with several people attending using Zoom. We will continue providing a Zoom link for future meetings for those who cannot attend in person. Chair Monique Peters welcomed everyone.

## Territorial Acknowledgement

Monique Peters acknowledged with gratitude that we meet on the territory of the Nipissing First Nation and that we honour the teachings of our Indigenous neighbours and thank them for their care of the land. Monique reminded us that June is Nation Indineous History Month. She also pointed out that the Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA) is promoting Kindness Week (Jun 9<sup>th</sup>- 13<sup>th</sup>).

#### **Activities**

Activities Manager, Mandy Gilchrist provided an overview of the summer global activities that are happening at Cassellholme. Each unit will also host a number of activities which are posted daily on the unit.

#### Monday

- The hymn sing continues at 10:30 a.m. with Sharon Paris providing piano accompaniment.

## Tuesday

- Residents are brought to the auditorium for a barbeque lunch. The menu will alternate between burgers/hot dogs and chicken on-a-bun/salad. Each unit will attend this lunch once a month on a rotating basis.
- On the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday Heather Gardner will lead a choir for residents.

## Wednesday

- Each week a garden party will be held in the oval garden with live music, refreshments and other treats. There will be no smoking in the garden during this time. Events will be moved into the auditorium in case of bad weather.
- TV Bingo stops for the summer, but residents will be brought to the waterfront to enjoy the City of North Bay's summer concert series.

#### • Thursday

- The residents will be offered rides on the newly purchased trishaw bike starting this month and running through to October (weather permitting).
- July 17<sup>th</sup> will be Donor Appreciation Day to thank those who contributed to the purchase of the bike which has electric assist, a wider seat with a seat belt and safety bar.

#### • French Programming

- There will be a French social group and a French mass – both held once a month.

#### Wine and Cheese

There will be a wine and cheese social held twice a month with Pat Dunn on Saturday afternoons.

## • Worship

- Non-denominational worship will be held each Sunday from 2:00 3:00 p.m. conducted by rotating leaders from local churches.
- A monthly calendar of all events is available on the website with a printed version posted around the building. Cancellation notices will be posted on the Cassellholme *facebook* page. All of this is made possible by the great staff of the activities department.

### **Cassellholme Update**

Tracy Davis, Resident and Family Navigator offered the following update about what is happening at Cassellholme.

- <u>Staffing</u> Mel Cross has been hired as the Acting Director of Care and she would like to attend the next Family Council meeting. Erin Brophy will be leaving her Nurse Practitioner position to attend medical school. Cassellholme's other Nurse Practitioner will stay on and planning for the future is ongoing.
- <u>Volunteers</u> Tracy is working on ramping up the volunteer program. She has been looking for ways to make more use of volunteers including as greeters at the front door (or at an information desk) during peak visiting times, reading to residents or answering the phones. There are plans to encourage more people to volunteer (including students during the summer) by offering flexible hours. It was suggested to try, if possible to coordinate hours so that some volunteers are available when the General Store is closed. One goal of this work is to improve hospitality at Cassellholme.
- Elder Abuse Awareness Tracy is planning a campaign to educate staff about elder abuse using the Residents' Bill of Rights which includes a section about the right of freedom from abuse and neglect. Tracy asked if members of Family Council would consider participating in making a video to help with this. We agreed to discuss this and then have Monique Peters contact Tracy to arrange a time for members to record a brief pre-written message.
- New Building It is estimated the move in will happen mid-September, but there is no firm date yet. Senior staff have been meeting with the logistics company to review the moving process. Tracy acknowledged that there is some concern and nervousness among staff, family members and residents. It is unlikely family members will be able to be at Cassellholme on moving day so that the process can play out as smoothly as possible. The logistics company is very experienced with moves such as this. As part of the process, family members will be contacted directly and will be consulted about their preferences regarding the move. These preferences will be considered but is may not be possible to entirely accommodate everyone's choices. Families will be informed about the timing of first visits after the move.
